

22.5-MILE TRAIL

HART-MONTAGUE TRAIL STATE PARK

Hart-Montague Trail is a linear state park that is an accessible, paved, 22.5-mile trail traversing 225 acres that passes through rural, forested lands, featuring scenic overlooks and picnic areas located along the route. **This is a Pure Michigan designated trail** and follows the former railroad line of the Grand Rapids and Lakeshore RR Company with trailheads in Hart, Shelby, and New Era. In the warmer months, it is open to hiking, biking, in-line skating, and if there is more than 4" inches of snow on the trail in winter, snowmobiling.

Hart Trailhead
North side of Polk Rd. next to Hansen Food (3770 W. Polk Rd., Hart)



The northern most trailhead with direct access near US-31 exit 149. This access point is also just east of the Silver Lake Sand Dunes Visitors Center.



Mears Trail Crossing
Crossing Joy Street, between 7th St. and W. Taylor Rd.

There is no parking or amenities at this crossing, however, you may park at the US Post Office in downtown Mears. This crossing is just 0.4 miles south on Joy St. near the Wood Shed Bike Shop

Shelby Trailhead
North side of 3rd St. one block west of Michigan Ave.



This large parking area offers large trailer parking and access to a large covered pavilion in the heart of downtown Shelby



New Era Trailhead
On 1st St. on block north of Ray St. in Downtown New Era



Parking is limited to just a few vehicles at this location. Parking area adjacent to "Tri-County Feeds - South Entrance"
