VEHICLE FAQ & PARKING REQUIREMENTS



If you are TRAILERING your own rig to ride the ORV section of the dunes, AND IT IS A WEEKEND OR HOLIDAY it is especially important to understand the parking voucher information so you can plan ahead to be sure you can ride the dunes.

THERE ARE TWO TYPES OF VEHICLES ON THE DUNES. STREET LICENSED AND NON-STREET LICENSED.

ARE YOU DRIVING A <u>STREET</u> <u>LICENSED</u>/DUNE READY VEHICLE?



ALL vehicles on the dunes that are street licensed vehicles with a license plate MUST have the following:

↓ #1: Have the Required Permits

Your street licensed vehicle **MUST** have all three of the required permits. An ORV Trail Permit, and ORV License and a Michigan DNR Recreation Passport. If your vehicle needs any of these permits, they may be purchased at the **ORV Welcome Center**. Review the complete quide on page 11 of this quide.

★ #2: Have a mounted safety flag & your vehicle is "dune ready"

ALL vehicles on the dunes must be "Dune Ready". To make sure your vehicle is dune ready, review the complete guide on page 11 of this guide.



ARE YOU TRAILERING A VEHICLE?



ALL ORV/ATV/Motorcycle (non-street licensed/no plate) vehicles requiring to be trailered and offloaded at one of the two designated parking areas MUST have the following:

IMPORTANT: Non-street licensed vehicles ARE NOT permitted on any local roads unless in the designated areas/lane in and around the ORV Welcome Center/ ORV Scramble Area of Silver Lake State Park.

#1: Have the Required Permits

Your ORV/ATV/Motorcycle (non street licensed) **MUST** have all three of the required permits. An ORV Trail Permit, and ORV License and a Michigan DNR Recreation Passport. If your recreational vehicle needs any of these permits, they may be purchased at the **ORV Welcome Center**. Review the complete guide on page 11 of this guide.

#2: Have a mounted safety flag & your vehicle is "dune ready"

ALL vehicles on the dunes must be "Dune Ready". To make sure your vehicle is dune ready, review the complete guide on page 11 of this guide.

#3: Have a Parking Voucher for one of the two designated parking areas

IF it is a Saturday, Sunday or a holiday you MAY need a Parking Lot Voucher - Parking lot vouchers are required for your tow vehicle and/or trailer to gain access at one of the designated areas. See the complete guide here for details.
